passing it on

"Hello, may I buy a Camp Henry t-shirt?" Those were the words spoken a few weeks ago by a lady named Jennifer who walked into the Camp Henry offices. As our staff began to help her she mentioned that she was the great, great niece of Gertrude and John Millar. As many of you know, the Millars were one of many important and generous families in the history of Camp Henry. A walk through camp will take you by some of the buildings they provided for camp - seven cabins, the blue staff house, the Millar Lodge and the Millar Office building. The influence of the Millar family on camp is profound!

Jennifer wanted to hear all about the summer at camp. She also wanted a new camp t-shirt but she had no idea what else we had for her! A few weeks earlier, one of our summer staff came across an old leather-bound New Testament Bible in Millar Lodge. The printing date was 1913 and the gold engraving on the cover said 'John Millar'. Somehow this Bible made its way to camp and was misplaced for several years. When it was given to me I held it wondering what should be done with it. I decided that time would answer that question and, if nothing else, someday it could be put on display next to other pieces honoring John and Gertrude Millar.

I shared the story of finding the Bible with Jennifer and asked her if she

wanted it. Tears instantly came to her eyes. Explaining that her father is the family historian, Jennifer mentioned that her dad's birthday was coming up and until today she had no idea what to give him. She said she was pretty sure it was going to make her dad cry.

Jennifer stuck around for a while that day. She told stories about her experiences at Camp Henry and asked questions about what it was like now. "Do they still.....On Sundays do they.....Is the campfire still?" Before she left, Jennifer looked at us and said these words.

"You know Camp Henry made me who I am today. I discovered my faith in God there at camp. The values I live by today come from what I learned and experienced at camp. The integrity I try to live my life with came from Camp Henry. That place is amazing!"

Yes, it is. Seventy-one years of history. Seventy-one years of lives impacted forever. For over seventy years children and adults like Jennifer have discovered or strengthened their faith in God, tried new things, had the best time of their lives and made friendships that will last forever. That is why we exist. Whether it is a summer camper, a child who comes with a school or church group, or an adult who comes with his or her company for a corporate training, they all experience Camp Henry as a place that is different and amazing. I like to think of camp as being a glimpse of the world God intended for us.

But it takes the entire community to keep the mission, vision and dream of Camp Henry alive. It takes people like John and Gertrude Millar who invested their

time and financial resources. It takes the staff who are called to serve at camp to give all they have to make a difference. The summer of 2008 marks the 60th Anniversary of the Accreditation Program of the American Camp Association (ACA). For over 60 years, ACA's accreditation program has focused on establishing and enhancing health and safety practices at camps. Accreditation by ACA goes well beyond state licensing policies and procedures. Being accredited by ACA indicates that not only does a camp have an appropriate state license, but also indicates that the camp has gone above and beyond the minimal state requirements and is meeting the highest standards and best practices in the camping industry.

ACA accreditation is voluntary, and Camp Henry is proud to have been accredited for the last 18 years. This summer a team of visitors came to Camp Henry to conduct a thorough site visit, which involved meeting with multiple staff, visiting with campers, interviewing directors, viewing facilities, reviewing policies, and evaluating procedures.

Camp Henry met all 31 of the mandatory standards - that address the most crucial and important health and safety aspects of our camp. In addition, Camp Henry met 98% of the remaining 286 standards. Our ACA accreditation visit provides us with an excellent opportunity to pause and evaluate the strengths of Camp Henry and identify where we can improve.

We will be proud once again to be able to display and utilize the ACA Accredited Camp logo for the coming year. This logo indicates to parents and the public that Camp Henry has voluntary allowed our practices to be compared to the industry best practices by professionals in the camp industry - and that Camp Henry provides a healthy, safe, quality, and contemporary program and facility.

As many of you already know, Camp Henry has been helping kids come to camp for a long time - since 1938 as a matter of fact! This year, our summer camp scholarship donors made it possible for 412 children to spend a great week at camp - that is about 1/3rd of all summer campers. Scholarship requests went up this year and came from a broad variety of families in West Michigan. The prolonged economic downturn in Michigan means that many middle income families are out of jobs and out of savings. Receiving scholarship aid became the only way for some of these families to send their children to camp. Camp Henry awards scholarships on a sliding scale and families try hard to pay what they can. Camp had a waiting list by June but managed to accommodate nearly every child by the end

of summer camp.

For some children, summer camp is their only chance to get out of the city and have a chance to spend a week filled with activities that help them have fun, learn new things and make new friends. For others, it is a chance to leave isolated rural surroundings and spend a week with nearly 200 other children.

Camp is an opportunity that can change lives. One mom wrote "...your donors gave something to our child we couldn't provide for by ourselves...a sense of zany security. She's loved and appreciated for who she is, by people who don't 'have to' love her or appreciate her. Truly, Jesus played with the children, and a

child's joy is a model for trusting in the Kingdom of Heaven."

Another mom wrote, "Teddy told me that he'd like to work at the camp and help kids. He said that someday he'd like to send someone to camp and give them an opportunity like he was given."

And one of our campers wrote: "I was really worried that I couldn't save up enough to go to camp this year. When I got the letter, I literally jumped for joy. Thank you so much. You made my year."

So, I don't think I could say it better than this young camper. Thank you so much, donors. You made their year!
